5. Centre Facilities

- Buildings and grounds: co-located into a new building, on the site of the McLaren Vale Primary School.

- Centre Ownership: The premises are owned by Department for Education
- Access for children and staff with disabilities: Indoor and outdoor wheelchair access. Wheelchair access through main gate.

6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

- General characteristics: (eg. types of work available, languages usually spoken at home, local developments): The centre is situated in McLaren Vale in the Onkaparinga Council which is a semi-rural wine growing area. Families using this centre come from a variety of Anglo Saxon and multicultural backgrounds. It has a growing number of single parent families and the majority of parents are working or studying.
- Parent and community involvement in the preschool: The community and parents are strongly involved in the centre management and show an interest in the children's progress and development. Staff aim for "partnerships" with parents, not just superficial parental involvement.
- Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool: McLaren Vale Primary School, McLaren Flat Primary School, Tatachilla Lutheran College, Galille Catholic School, Southern Vales Christian College, All Saints Catholic School, Kangarilla Primary School.
- Other local care and educational facilities, eg child care, schools, OSHC: McLaren Vale Childcare Centres – Local Kids and Blossomvale. Montessori Children's Centre, McLaren Vale. OSHC at McLaren Vale Primary, McLaren Flat Primary and Willunga Primary.
